

FIRE PREVENTION

Do not leave burning candles unattended.

Keep candles, matches, and lighters away from children.

All lighters should have child safety locks.

Use sturdy candleholders that won't tip over or ignite.

Keep lit candles at least one foot away from curtains, mattresses and other combustibles.

Trim candle wicks to one-quarter inch before lighting.

Never place debris in the wax pool.

CANDLE SAFETY



Properly extinguish candles. Do not use water to extinguish candles.

Extinguish candles to within two inches of the holder.

Candles should be extinguished with candle snuffers or spoons to reduce the risk of hot wax splattering and causing injury.

Do not move a burning candle.

Do not leave the room until the wick from an extinguished candle is no longer glowing.

If the height of the flame escalates, extinguish the uncontrolled flame immediately.

Do not use candles as a substantial source of light during a power outage. Flashlights are a safer, more reliable source of light.

Do not use a candle as a night light.

Candles should not be lit for more than four hours at a time.

Light candles on heat resistant surfaces.

Immediately discard candles if the glass holder becomes cracked.
